Autumn Term 2021 - Year 3/4



Listed below are the topics to be covered next term by your child's class. We hope you find the information helpful.

English	We will be basing our writing on our focus text of the term - 'The Tunnel' by Anthony Browne. We will be writing an image poem based on a forest, a setting description of the little girl entering the forest and narrative - extended writing changing the setting.
Maths	Number and place value up to 1,000 (Year 3) and 10,000 (Year 4) Children will also be working on their addition and subtraction strategies within their year group.
Science	Our main topic is animals including humans. We will be looking at the role of the skeleton within our bodies, and also that of different animals. We will also be discussing the importance of nutrition for a healthy diet. Our last focus is on the types and functions of our teeth.
Geography	We will be learning about mining and quarrying with our focus being on the local quarry at Ancaster. We will be identifying and comparing this quarry with another in the UK as well as looking at the impact of natural and human resources and sustainability.
Religious Education	What is the Trinity? We will be focusing on what Christians believe the Trinity is and how they show their beliefs through their practices.

PSHE	We will be looking at Relationships - particularly families. We will be identifying different families and the importance of family.
Physical Education	Football and fitness.
Computing	Handling Data - using different programs to present data collected.

Please make sure your child reads at home every day and learns times tables and weekly spellings, preferably with an adult.
