Daily Routine

- School starts at 8.40am. Please enter through the door in the main Reception area.
- A typical day in Reception will include:
- Phonics we follow the Read Write Inc scheme of work.
- Continuous provision inside and outside learning activities accessed independently by the children.
- Snack Time- children receive milk and a piece of fresh fruit daily. Please ensure you are registered with Cool Milk.
- Carpet time all areas of learning are taught to the whole class throughout the week.
- Lunch- we are fortunate enough to have an experienced chef within our academy who uses a range of fresh produce daily to create a wide range of meals (an example menu can be found on our school website)
- Funky fingers activities
- Maths carpet time
- Continuous provision inside and outside learning activities accessed independently by the children.
- Story and singing times.
- School finishes at 3pm.





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What your child will need

- Waterproof Coat
- Sun hat and sun cream (weather depending)
- Spare Clothes if needed
- Named uniform
- ►PE kit

A Book bag and water bottle will be provided

In preparation for school

- Support your child to be toilet trained and use the toilet independently where possible.
- Encourage good hygiene and hand washing.
- Encourage your child to get dressed independently.
- Support your child to use a knife and fork.
- Support your child to learn how to share with others and take turns.
- Encourage independence skills for the school day i.e. carry their own bag into school.
- Encourage your child to recognise their name and belongings by labelling everything clearly (coat, jumper, book bag, lunchbox etc.)
- 'Ditch the dummy'

In preparation for school

- Sharing books together daily helps your child develop a love of books and stories.
- Develop fine motor skills by threading, using dough, small tweezers, rolling tissue paper or any other activities to let little fingers move.
- Play counting games.
- Recite nursery rhymes including number songs.
