We will also learn how to recognise and describe how living things differ to non-living things, and how they change as they grow (including plants and animals).	As writers we will: Be completing writing daily in RWi lessons. In English we will be writing a narrative to retell a story from a different point of view or change of character.	In computing we will: Know that people sometimes behave differently online and the importance of online safety. We will also be creating animated stories online.
	In RE we will: Be exploring the Islamic faith, finding out what Muslims do to express their beliefs, and learn about different celebrations that are important to Muslims, including Ramadan.	As artists we will: Be discovering the well-known artist Picasso. Whilst using Picassos famous line drawing to explore a new way of expressing art, we will also develop our knowledge of colour and tone.	In PHSE we will: Discuss how important family and friends are in making us feel happy, loved, and secure. We will also learn about how money and work are linked and understand their importance.
