Enquiry Question: Are there different kinds of love?

Home learning project: To discuss members of your family and when they were born. Create a timeline to show this information.

Our key text is:

The Robot and the Bluebird by David Lucas.



As mathematicians we will:

Yr 1 – continue to work on addition and subtraction within 20 and practice counting in 2s 5s and 10s as well as using the provision in the classroom to look at measurement of length, height, mass and volume.

Yr 2 – be working on multiplication and division for the 2-, 5- and 10-times tables and counting, comparing and finding change using money.

In computing we will:

Be using 2beat to change the speed of the tune, add a range of instrumental sounds and compose our own music. We will also use 2Create to support our art learning.

As scientists we will:

Be identifying what living things need to survive. We will recognise how living and non-living things differ. We will be observing over time as we grow plants.

In art we will:

Be exploring sculpture, focusing on the illustrator Matt Dixon. We will use computers to design a robot draw and create our own sculptures with recycled objects. We will evaluate pieces of art using simple language linked to artistic elements.

As historians we will:

Be locating key members of our families on a timeline (chronology) as part of exploring our personal history. We will explore the term sources.

As musicians we will:

Identify and describe slow and fast tempos. We be identifying the pulse of the music and exploring AB structure. We will identify note length and we will learn and perform the song All you need is love by The Beatles.

In RE we will:

Be exploring thankfulness in more detail, looking at how people express thanks across a range of religions and worldviews.

In PHSE we will:

Understand how important family and friendships are in making us feel happy, loved, and secure.

In PE we will:

Be building on our athletics skills, focusing on the consolidation of basic large and small movements and to apply these to running, jumping, and throwing.

As writers we will:

Be completing writing daily in RWi lessons. We will be retelling our story from a different point of view, or by changing a character. We will be writing a set of instructions. For World Poetry Day we will be writing poems for a special person in our lives.

As readers we will:

Continue our phonics journey to develop our decoding skills. We will enjoy a range of stories and develop our fluency and comprehension of texts using VIPERS.
