LKS2 science proved a HUGE success last week in school, they were given a collection of animal pictures and asked how they would classify them. Once they had done this using a Venn diagram, they learnt the difference between vertebrates and invertebrates. They then classified vertebrates into the 5 different categories of mammals, fish, amphibians, reptiles and birds. At the very end of the lesson, they played 20 questions, using their science knowledge they had to try and guess the animal by asking up to 20 questions that could only have a yes or no answer. There were some very successful classifying happening in the classroom!
