We are honest, ensuring that our actions are guided by strong moral principles that we refuse to change. 'The integrity of the upright guides them' Proverbs 11:3.



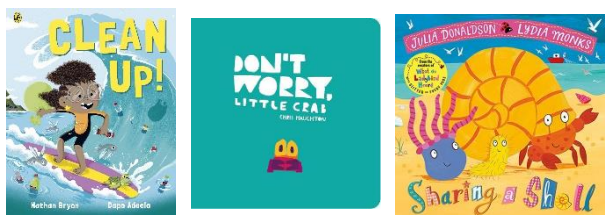
Reception Summer Term 2

Termly Theme: Beside the Sea

Home learning:

- **Hear your child read their reading book at least three times per week and record in their reading diary.**
- **Watch the phonics videos that are sent home.**
- **Practise number bonds to 10 e.g. 3+2=5, 4+1=5, 3+1=4, 1+3=4 etc.**

Our key texts are:



As writers we will be:

- Continuing to remember the sentence we want to write, then writing it using a capital letter, finger spaces and a full stop.
- Using 'Fred fingers' to spell words using the sounds they have learnt in their RWI phonics lessons.
- Reading our writing to check for any mistakes.

We are understanding more about the world we live in by:

Using the key text 'Clean Up!' we will be learning about caring for the environment and all living things, sea pollution and recycling.

We will be focusing on change through the story 'Don't Worry Little Crab', which will support the children in their transition to year 1. We will be working closely with their new teacher to build relationships and exploring the feelings that they may have related to moving to year 1. We will support transition through several activities, stories, circle times and individual transition timetables where required.

We will also be learning about keeping safe when online and how to use online activities with the support of adults.

As mathematicians we will be:

- Exploring sharing and grouping
- Building doubles
- Creating and exploring patterns
- Describing positions
- Creating our own maps

To support our physical development we will:

- Complete the 'Fundamentals 2' unit in PE lessons. We will be learning:
- To try new challenges, deciding on the skills I use to complete the task.
 - To negotiate space safely with consideration for myself and others.
 - To play co-operatively, take turns and congratulate others.
 - To play games honestly with consideration of the rules.
 - To use movement skills with developing balance and co-ordination.

We will use these skills to practice and compete in sports day on Wednesday 24th June.

As valuable members of our class we will:

- Continue to be kind and caring towards our friends.
- Respect and celebrate each other's differences
- Express our thoughts and feelings to help us resolve conflicts and seek comfort
